
Day 3: Tuesday, July 18 (B,D)

Day 1: Thursday, Sept. 28

This morning, visit the **Millbrook Heritage and Cultural Centre** to learn about the **Mi'kmaq people**. **Joggins Fossil Cliffs – a UNESCO World Heritage Site** on the spectacular Bay of Fundy is next. We'll cross the Canso Causeway to **Cape Breton Island** where you will overnight in Port Hawkesbury.



Day 6: Tuesday, Oct. 3 (B,D)

Visit the Glenora Distillery for a tour and tasting before continuing on to beautiful Baddeck, your home for the next three nights. Before checking into your accommodations on the Bras d'or Lake, visit **Alexander Graham Bell National Historic Site** to learn of the many accomplishments of

and American Rockies, the Andes, the Alps and the Highlands of Scotland, but for simple beauty, **Cape Breton out rivals** them all!"

Day 7: Wednesday, Oct. 4 (B, Box Lunch)

You are off to experience one of the most **stunningly picturesque drives in North America. The Cabot Trail** winds around the rocky splendor of Cape Breton's northern shore, ascending to the incredible plateaus of **Cape Breton Highlands National Park**. Look-offs offer unforgettable vistas of Cape Breton's rugged coastline, so be sure to have your camera on hand. Your day is complemented by a visit to **Cheticamp's Paroisse Saint-Pierre**. Built in 1893, the church is a fine example of French-Canadian neo-classical church architecture.

Day 4: Monday, December 4 (B,D)



This led to the "**shot heard around the world**" in Concord and started the **American Revolution** on that fateful night of April 18, 1775. The Church was built in 1723 and is the oldest church in Boston, is still in operation and has an active congregation.

Gingerbread House Making lunch at CHEERS! Remember the television show "Cheers" where everyone knew your name? It really was filmed in Boston and we are going there for lunch! Discover the **Isabella Stewart Gardner Museum**.

The art collection is displayed in a **15th century Venetian-style palazzo** with a beautiful flowering courtyard. "The architecture, arrangement of the


